Yes – as per PPN 06/20, new Procurements above threshold will include elements of the social value model in scoring criteria. The aim will be to weight this at 10% to allow enough weight to be placed. Exact criteria will be determined dependent on the scope of the procurement/requirement. This requirement will become mandatory from April 2022, the Trust have begun to implement this in new procurements as best practice from April 2021.
