We are writing in response to your request submitted under the Freedom of Information Act, received in this office on 14th July 2021.

Your request was as follows:

Do trusts have set reject analysis rates for plain film if so:

- □ What is the reject analysis rate?
- ☐ How frequently do you monitor reject analysis?
- If the monitored rate is non-compliant with the set target (if stated above) what systems do you have in place for follow up?

For reject analysis rate for plain film The Walton Centre NHS Foundation Trust have set a low target of 4%, against national averages (usually around 8%) this is monitored monthly via audits, training, quality assurance and follow up Reviews.
