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## Re: Freedom of Information Request FOI 5452

We are writing in response to your request submitted under the Freedom of Information Act, received in this office on 23rd November 2022.

Your request was as follows:

I am writing regarding funding provided by the government in 2019-20, distributed to your Trust via Health Education England (HEE), to improve rest facilities for junior doctors in line with the BMA Fatigue and Facilities Charter.

I understand from HEE that your Trust was provided with of this funding.

1. ☐ Please detail how this money was spent on improving rest facilities for junior doctors.

The Trust received £30k from NHS England, as opposed to Higher Education England.

Junior doctor's facilities were to be upgraded, with the initial £30k being the catalyst. Upon investigation and initial designs, what was required was much more that this, therefore, NHS Charities contributed a further £50k. This (now) £80k was match funded via Trust capital monies to provide an overall pot of circa £160k. This money was then expended to strip out and expand the older accommodation, containing 3 No. overnight bedrooms, producing a newer, modern environment, with 5 No. overnight bedrooms.
